Scholarly journal	Striner, Richard. "Political Newtonism: The Cosmic Model of Politics in Europe and America." <i>William and Mary Quarterly</i> 3 rd ser. 52.4 (1995): 583-608. Print. (note: for date of publication only the year is needed)
Magazine	McEvoy, Dermot. "Little Books, Big Success." <i>Publishers Weekly</i> 30 Oct. 2006: 26-28. Print. (note: for date of publication the day, month, and year should be included when available)
Newspaper	Author’s Last name, First name. “Title of the article.” <i>Name of paper as it appears on masthead</i> complete date, edition, section: page number. Publication medium.
	(the section may be included in the page number or sometimes paginated separately)

Website	Author’s Last name, First name. “Title of the Work.” <i>Title of the site.</i> Publisher or sponsor, date of publication/last updated. Publication medium. Date of access. <address of the site>. (note: if no author look for a compiler, editor, narrator or organization that created it.)

Date of access.</p> <p>(note: drop the original publication medium. The article may not include page numbers. If possible, give page number range or when it is not continuous the first page and a +. When pagination is not available use n. pag.)</p>

Pamphlet/ Brochure	<p>(Treat like a book)</p> <p>Author Last name, First name if listed. Title of the Pamphlet. City: Publisher, date of publication. Publication Medium.</p> <p>Washington, DC. New York: Trip Builder, 2000. Print.</p>
